1. The league will be known as the Unisys Mixed Bowling League.
2. The league will bowl at Plaza Lanes.

3. The league will bowl on Wednesdays at $\mathbf{5 : 1 5} \mathbf{~ p m}$. Plaza Lanes will make the lanes available for warm-up at 5:00 pm. We must complete our bowling by 7:15 pm.
4. The league will bowl 27 sessions. The first session is Wednesday, September 12, 2007. The final session is April 2, 2008. The league will not bowl November 21 and December 26.
5. This is a handicap mixed league. This league shall bowl three games per night.
6. The season will be divided into halves, each containing twelve sessions.
a) The team in first place after bowling Week 13 will be the winner of the first half. The team in first place after bowling Week 26 will be the winner of the second half.
b) To determine the league champion, the winner of the first half will bowl the winner of the second half on Week 27. These two teams will bowl on the first pair of lanes.
c) Final standings for the season are determined by 26 weeks of bowling. Results from Week 27 do not count towards final standings for the season, but they do count towards your personal stats. To determine the final standings for all teams, points that each team has won in each half will be added together. The sum is the total points won for the season.
7. The last session (Week 27) will be an optional doubles tournament.
a) Bowlers, arranged by descending average, will partner in pairs - but physically bowl with their regular team. The bowler with the highest average will partner with the bowler with the lowest average. Winning pairs have the greatest combined pins over average. Nonparticipating bowlers contribute zero to the partnership's total score.
b) Only participating bowlers receive prize payouts.
c) Lane assignments will be determined after Week 26.
8. There will be three position round nights within each half-season (to allow this year's 8 teams to bowl an equal number of games against each other): Weeks 5, 9, 13, 18, 22 and 26.
9. Two points are awarded for each game won and one point for each series won.
10. The team handicap shall be the sum of the bowlers' individual handicaps.
11. Handicaps for bowlers shall be 100 percent of the difference between the bowler's average and 220.
12. The bowling fee is $\$ 10.00$ per person per session. Bowlers are required to pay for the last session no later than the third session. A permanent bowler is responsible for all fees missed as a result of their absence. Substitutes pay $\$ 5.00$ to cover the cost of bowling. A bowler
more than twenty dollars in arrears will not be permitted to bowl until a payment schedule has been arranged with the Treasurer.
13. This league will be certified with the United States Bowling Congress (USBC). Per USBC requirements, bowlers must pay certification fees on their first session of bowling.
14. A bowler must bowl six games to establish an average in this league. For the first six games bowled, a bowler's average is determined as follows:

- Bowlers with a book average from last season will use that average for the first six games of bowling.
- Female bowlers without a book average shall carry a $\mathbf{1 4 0}$ average for the first six games of bowling. This value represents the league's 2006-2007 female average.
- Male bowlers without a book average shall carry a 171 average for the first six games of bowling. This value represents the league's 2006-2007 male average.

15. Each team will include three bowlers, and may include a fourth optional member on their roster. The "fourth member" is considered a permanent team/league member and may not substitute for any other team. Only three scores are recorded for each game. A team must have one permanent member bowling or the team will forfeit that session. A team must use the scores of at least one male and one female.
16. A dummy position (caused by the resignation of a bowler or an unfilled position) will use an average of 171 for a male position and 140 for a female position.
17. If an absent bowler does not have a USBC-certified substitute, the team will use the permanent bowler's average minus 10 pins when computing the absent bowler's score.
18. A substitute's score cannot be used on a position night. If a team roster includes an optional fourth bowler, the fourth bowler is not a substitute and therefore is eligible to bowl on position nights.
19. If a permanent member resigns from the league on or before session 21 , the replacement will be considered a permanent bowler. If a permanent member resigns on or after session 22, the replacement will be considered a substitute.
20. A bowler must have bowled at least $50 \%$ of the season as a permanent league member to be eligible for high game and high series awards. (Note that USBC Rule \#117b requires a bowler to participate in two-thirds of all games in a season to be eligible for any other awards or prizes.)
21. Handicap awards shall be tracked after the bowler's sixth week of bowling.
22. Each team must elect a captain. The captain must

- Retrieve weekly standing sheets from the web site (http://www.bowl.com) and distribute to their teammates.
- Collect the bowling fees from their team members. (Fees are to be recorded on the envelope, verified for accuracy, and remitted to the Treasurer before the end of the first game.)
- Record the results on the score card. (Score cards are to be completed, verified for accuracy, and signed by both captains. Cards are to be submitted to the Secretary at the end of each session.)
- Arrange a postponement session, in advance of bowling, when team cannot bowl as scheduled.

23. Score cards are the league's official record of scores bowled. They may be changed by the Secretary only when an obvious error has occurred and both captains agree to the change.
24. The Treasurer will provide a prize list for approval by the Board of Directors before the end of the first half.
25. A bowler must have arrived and be ready to bowl by the end of the third frame. If not, the bowler is considered absent for that game and may start at the beginning of the next game.
26. The championship roll-off will be based on the number of points won on the roll-off session. In case of a tie at the end of a half, there will be a one game roll-off to determine the winner.
27. League officers will be compensated as follows (based on this season's bowling fees paid to Plaza Lanes of $\$ 6$ per person per week):

- Secretary shall be compensated for eight (8) free weeks of bowling, equivalent to $\$ 48$.
- Treasurer shall be compensated for six (6) free weeks of bowling, equivalent to $\$ 36$.
- President shall be compensated for four (4) free weeks of bowling, equivalent to $\$ 24$.
- Vice-President shall be compensated for (2) two free weeks of bowling, equivalent to \$12.

The Treasurer may determine how best to distribute these compensations, for example, by applying credits for the compensation amount to the final weeks of the season.
28. Observe one lane courtesy. The bowler on the right should bowl if both reach the approach at the same time. Stay off the approach while you wait.
29. The Board of Directors has the authority to adopt a new rule or amend an existing rule as necessary.
